

making a difference GRANTS TO THE COMMUNITY



While we work with and support many important services and causes in the Manhattan area, 2019 was a big year for the arts in our community. A new organization on the scene, Incite MHK, drove the completion of a large-scale mural project that generated buzz and made a big impact. GMCF supported the project through grant funding from the Lincoln and Dorothy Deihl Community Grants Program, which awards funds to projects likely to have a major impact on community efforts in the arts, basic human needs, and youth programming. This funding allowed Incite MHK to contract with a mural art curation company called Justkids.









Justkids introduced Incite MHK to internationally renowned mural artists, Bicicleta Sem Freio (Portuguese for "Bicycle Without Brakes"). The Brazilian duo, Douglas de Castro and Renato Perreira, arrived in Downtown Manhattan in the end of October and braved the chilly Kansas weather to paint their mural. Over the course of a week, the team created a beautiful piece entitled, "Anotações," or "Notes." GMCF's hope is that this grant funding adds to the momentum in Manhattan's arts scene.

The Community School for the Performing Arts (CSPA), a partnership between the Manhattan Arts Center and the School of Music, Theatre, and Dance at Kansas State University, offers high-quality music lessons to the community. Since 2018, The Greater Manhattan Community Foundation has supported a violin teacher and lessons through the Lincoln & Dorothy Deihl Community Grants Program. Before CSPA, many parents drove their children to Topeka or Lawrence in order to take violin lessons. In 2018, CSPA recruited Dr. Laura Eakman to lead more than 40 students per semester in group lessons and to teach up to 52 individual students per semester. Dr. Eakman's students have participated in recitals, individual performances, and performances at local venues like the Sunset Zoo. CSPA also offers classes for singers, pianists, percussionists, and more. Over 30 instructors lead lessons, classes, or workshops, providing the community with a valuable set of musical education opportunities.

The Flint Hills Children's Choir is open to Manhattan area youth in grades 3-10. This program seeks to provide exceptional musical experiences for youth in the community. In 2019, GMCF supported FHCC's mission with a \$5,000 grant for youth opportunity and personal development through the Grants for Greater Manhattan program. Throughout 2018-2019, FHCC performed for the Manhattan Area Retired Educators Luncheon, Beta Sigma Phi Preferential Tea, Meadowlark Hills Retirement Community, and area church services. In addition to these wonderful local performance opportunities, 35 members of FHCC traveled to New York to collaborate with four other children's choirs in an unforgettable Carnegie Hall performance. The coming seasons will bring more exceptional experiences for the youth of FHCC.
